Learning More About Lincoln

As a long-time student and admirer of Abraham Lincoln, I stand in awe of the brilliance of his writing and speeches. I've only scratched the surface in reading some of the more than 16,000 books written about Lincoln and I'm always delighted to learn more.

A recent weekend trip to Springfield, Illinois with my sister and her husband added both to my knowledge and further curiosity about this complex and brilliant man. Highlights of the weekend trip included visits to the Lincoln Museum, the Lincoln home, and the Lincoln tomb. The Lincoln Library was not open on the day we visited – next time.

If you have even a casual interest in Lincoln, I encourage a visit to Springfield. Except for the Lincoln tomb, everything is within a short walking distance.

The Lincoln Museum is a modern high-tech museum that covers Lincoln's childhood through assassination. The Lincoln home was the only home he owned. He, Mary, and their sons lived there for 16 years. A four-block historic district of restored homes, dirt roads, and wooden sidewalks surrounds the home (seen to the right).

News from the Nominating Committee (NomCom)

Since the last edition of *MIND*, things have been happening. The first thing was the sudden reduction of the Committee by one, but we still have the three members required by the Central Indiana Mensa Bylaws. They are Alison Brown, Chair, Larry Marcus, and Petra Ritchie. We have met over dinner and a membership list, brainstormed like mad, and we came up with several likely candidates to recruit. We have talked to some of them already, but not all. If we have not yet contacted you, please get in touch with US!

I cannot stress enough the importance of the Executive Committee (ExCom) members to the efficient running of Central Indiana Mensa (CIM). Our group is of middling size, as Mensa groups go - in March we were 32nd out of 132* – but we cover a relatively large geographical area which brings special responsibilities and challenges with it. Yet, even a group with fewer than 600 members needs reliable leadership. We need a LocSec to give impetus and connect the members; we need a recording secretary to keep track of decisions and provide the minutes of the ExCom meetings to the Editor and thence the membership; we need a treasurer who will keep track of the group finances, monitor expenditures, pay our bills promptly and dole out money where it is needed to make being a member of CIM enjoyable for all.

The ExCom also appoints an Editor of the *MIND* (the publication and distribution of which is a requirement of American Mensa, Limited, but also an important perk of membership), a Webmaster, a Program Director, a Gifted Children's Coordinator, and a SIGHT Coordinator. CIM also likes to have a Hospitality Chair who oversees a delectable spread at meetings and a Membership Chair who takes new members under his or her wing. All of these functions can be filled from within the ExCom, but also by outside volunteers. For the sake of coordination, the more that are taken on

2012 Mensa Admission Testing Schedule

The Mensa Admissions Test sessions for 2012 will all be held at the Wayne Library, 198 South Girls School Road, Indianapolis, Indiana, on the following dates and times.

Date	Location	Registration Time	Test Start Time
Jun 16, 2012	Wayne Branch Library 198 S. Girl's School Rd. Indianapolis, IN	10:00 – 11:00	11:00 a.m.
Aug 18, 2012	(same)	10:00 – 11:00	11:00 a.m.
Oct 13, 2012	(same)	1:00 – 2:00	2:00 p.m.

The test will take about two hours to complete. Test takers are required to show a photo ID. Session limited to 30 candidates. Overflow will be rescheduled to the near future.

The fee of \$40 is payable by cash, check, or any major credit card. Candidates between 14-17 years old are required to have one of their parents also sign the registration form in my presence at the testing site. I am not permitted to test candidates under 14 years old. Candidates under 14 will need to apply to the American Mensa, Ltd. national office in Arlington, Texas using approved prior testing evidence. Further questions about prior evidence admission to Mensa may be answered by contacting Mary Spencer at 817-607-0060, Extension 5529.

No smoking, calculators, or scratch paper are allowed. Candidates are permitted to take each of the two tests comprising the Mensa Admissions Test battery only once in their lives. Candidates who qualify on either test will be invited to become a member. Please bring one or two #2 pencils. I also have plenty of extras.

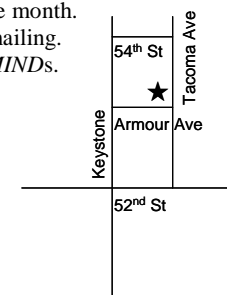

In the few years since we adopted a strategic plan, and raised our focus on things, AMC meetings have gotten thankfully shorter. This was not the case for the latest meeting on March 31, the last day of Mensa's fiscal year. We had a long agenda, and a proposed schedule that would hold the meeting to a mere ten hours. We held to that schedule quite well!



Most of our morning was filled with presentations by our Executive Director, Pam Donahoo. You could call it the "State of Mensa Address." Even though our membership has been down slightly the past two years, we're doing better than most similar organizations. And there are recent signs for optimism as testing is picking up. There is also a lot of excitement about a new marketing thrust that will get Mensa's name out on a daily basis to the general public, not unlike the glory days when Reader's Digest was promoting us.

This is the meeting at which we approve the budget. There were also other financial issues. One was updating our investment policy and how that relates to the price of a life membership. After you become a life member, your money is invested. The stream of income from that investment pays your dues every year. If we don't get enough from our investments, the price of a life membership has to go up! We hate to take big risks with this money, so for the past ten years we've only invested in government bonds, and current rates are very low. Our investment advisors showed us how by taking slight risks; investing in high grade industrial bond funds, and even a little in large cap (big company) stock funds we could improve our return without taking great risks. We are adopting the new policy and as a result, life membership rates will actually go down slightly for some ages.

There was also a lot of discussion about the AG in general; its size, price, and expectations of the attendees in terms of hospitality, programming, and accessibility. There's enough there for another column. One just before this year's AG.

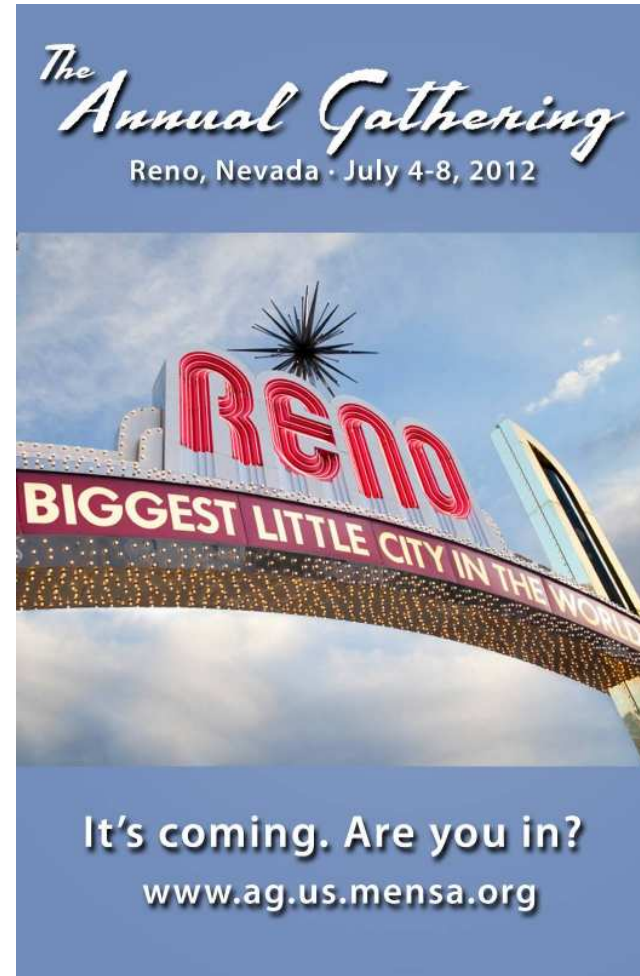

LocSec Teresa Gregory opened the meeting at 7:20 p.m. Members present included: Gregory, David Bonner, Jan Pfeil Doyle, Alan Schmidt, Karen Wilczewski, Bob Zdanky, and Karen Zwick. Absent: Cyndi Kuyper. Petra Ritchie was a guest.

The minutes of the January Ex-Com meeting were accepted with minor corrections. (Jan Pfeil Doyle moved; Karen Zwick seconded the motion. It passed unanimously)

Teresa Gregory presented the Treasurer's report for Alan Schmidt. The balance as of 2/20/12 was \$21,139. (Karen Zwick moved to accept the Treasurer's report; Jan Pfeil Doyle seconded the motion. It passed unanimously)

Once these updates are complete, David is turning over management of the website to Ann Hake, who has volunteered to maintain it. Bob Zdanky has agreed to serve as the backup person to Ann.

Alison Brown has agreed to serve as chairperson of the Nominating Committee for the upcoming election of CIM officers. Petra Ritchie will serve on the committee. Marcele Everest has agreed to serve as an advisor to the committee. Every member will receive a paper copy of the *MIND* in September, the month the election is conducted, because the issue will contain a ballot.

Bob Zdanky will be sending out letters to new members, inviting them to attend a newly instituted quarterly new member dinner, along with a coupon capped at \$20 to cover the cost of their meal. 
