Old Dog / New Tricks

The old saying is, “You can’t teach an old dog new tricks.” I tend to think that learning new tricks keeps people from becoming old dogs. I’ve met some incredibly young-but-chronologically-challenged lifelong learners in Mensa. The old cliché, “Use it or lose it,” is verified by them and their very active brains.

I’m also convinced that you can learn just about anything on the internet. To that end, I’d like to explore some learning opportunities that are available, for FREE, on the internet. (I’m all about “free”!)

I have just started my first online class through Coursera.org. I read about it this summer. There were 8 universities affiliated at that time. Started in April, 2012, by two Stanford University professors, it now offers classes from 33 international colleges and universities. Professors present videotaped lectures, there are homework assignments and testing, additional reading material is suggested, and if you complete the course with a certain grade, you receive a certificate.

The idea behind it is that this will give people world-wide an opportunity for education. The dream is that it will turn into a real online college opportunity resulting in real credits and a real degree. When this happens,

it will cost real money, but I think expenses would be less due to the huge volume and low overhead. And if you show up to class with a hang-over from last night’s frat party, you won’t be annoying your classmates.

With Corsera, there are opportunities to interact with classmates via message boards and there are even Meetup groups. At this writing, the Indianapolis Meetup group is planning an early Saturday morning meeting with a professor from the IUPUI School of Social Work offering to cook breakfast.

Harvard and MIT joined forces in May and launched edX. UCal-Berkley has joined them.

If you don’t mind shuffling through advertising, OpenCulture.com is a collection of online courses primarily from iTunes.

So why would someone want to spend time “taking” a class for no credit? For a lifelong learner on a budget, this is golden opportunity. For a parent of a gifted child, this is a chance for enrichment. For a person curious about a particular field of education or discipline, this is a chance to sample it risk-free. For the person who needs a refresher course but can’t take it during conventional hours, this is available 24 hours. It’s all good.

So check out so online learning opportunities and teach the old dog a new trick or two.

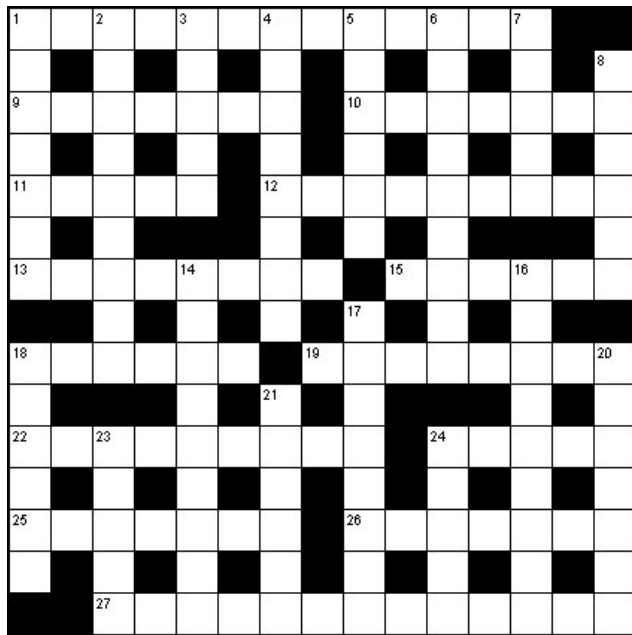

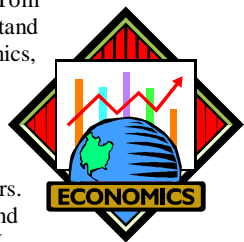

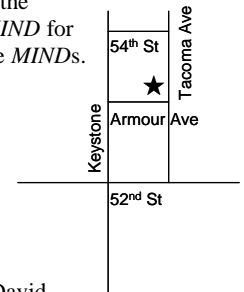

LocSec Teresa Gregory opened the meeting at 7:07 p.m. Members present included: David Bonner, Jan Pfeil Doyle, Teresa Gregory, Cyndi Kuyper, Alan Schmidt, Karen Wilczewski, Bob Zdany, and Karen Zwick. Guests included: Ann Hake, Petra Ritchie, and Linda Schmidt.

The minutes of the July Ex-Com meeting were accepted with minor corrections. (Jan Pfeil Doyle moved; Karen Zwick seconded the motion. It passed unanimously.)

Alan Schmidt presented the Treasurer's report, which showed the balance as of 8/28/12 to be \$20,658.43 (Karen Zwick moved to accept the Treasurer's report; Jan Pfeil Doyle seconded the motion. It passed unanimously.)

The membership report showed 519 members, 4 new members, 3 reinstating members, 3 renewing members, and 18 prospects.

Old Business


