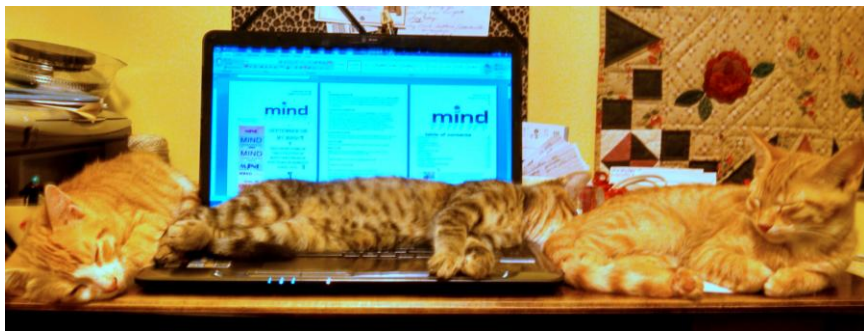

It was great to see families that have been coming to this event for four or five years, and we got to meet three new families, one of which just joined Mensa a week or two earlier. One of the parents told me that this has been a very meaningful event for her son for many years. Michael Reed was a huge help, and he has offered to help with the Family Program events in the future. He's really good with the kids, and enormously helpful with keeping things running smoothly throughout the weekend. It's great to have him on board!



I got a call from one of the new families Friday afternoon. "We're at Pretty Lake, but we can't find you." After unsuccessfully trying to find a common landmark, I finally asked what the last town they drove through was. Middlebury. Apparently there is another "Pretty Lake" but it's not the same Pretty Lake in Plymouth, Indiana where we've had this event for the past four years. They were less than 10 miles from the Michigan border in an entirely wrong part of the state! Nearly five hours after they left home, a tightly packed small car with three hungry kids, two exhausted parents, and a windsurfing board strapped to the top rolls in. I felt so bad for them, but they made it and ended up having a grand time!

I think the highlight of this year for me was the sailboats. Sailing is such an incredible experience. Clipping through the water at high speeds with just the sound of the wind in your sails and waves lapping against your hull is nothing short of exhilarating! On the open water I feel a connection with sailors from thousands of years ago who only had wind for propulsion. Sailing easy to learn, but it takes years to intimately know and harness the ever-changing forces of nature. It's ok be confident, but you can never let your guard down even for a moment. When I'm out on my own, I feel like I'm with an old friend and foe, the wind. We've always had our little 1970 model Sunfish, but the 43 year old sail fell apart last summer in the high winds. Aside from being ridiculously expensive, it's nearly impossible to find a replacement sail for a boat this old. Instead, we looked on Craigslist and found a 1980's model 14.2' Catalina Capri racing class boat for an incredible price. It sails like a dream! In the mean time I found a local company that sells sailcloth (Dacron) for around \$10/yard. Six yards was enough to make an entire sail for the Sunfish. I

taught myself how to use a sewing machine, and the sail was ready to go in less than a day. One of the families brought their own windsurfing board to add to the excitement. It was tons of fun to have three sailing boats on the lake at the same time.

Another highlight was the midnight swim. The cooler temperatures this summer were just right for camping, and the lake was a perfect temperature. After it got dark, we roasted smores. This is always a gooey endeavor, so we jumped in the lake to wash off. The moon was bright and visibility was excellent. After the kids retired in their tents, many of the adults remained in the lake and talked well into the morning. Everything was so perfect.

This year went really smoothly overall, and we're looking forward to doing it again in 2015. It will probably be held in late July.

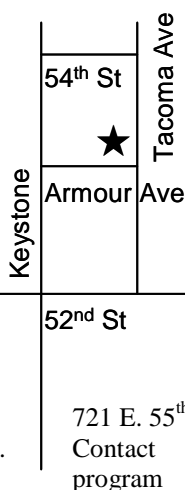

How to Engage Your Members at the Local Level

A majority of Mensa members never attend a meeting, never participate in online forums and never travel to a Regional or Annual Gathering. They might be content to just carry the Mensa card in their wallet.

Maybe they are reading your newsletter and thinking of venturing out to meet other Mensans but they're not sure what to expect. How can you engage them and encourage their participation at the local level?



We are very fortunate in Wisconsin and Upper Michigan to have numerous groups and area coordinators who plan events and coordinate activities. To encourage this, the Executive Committee has approved an annual \$500 fund for each group to use for member events. The goal is to offer as many local activities as possible to reach as many new and current members as we can.

After all, aren't the dues we collect intended to support our members?

John Sheelk is a recently renewed Mensa member who jumped in at the local level and started coordinating a monthly dinner in the Oshkosh area. When John learned about the \$500 available for an activity, he asked the group for suggestions and the outcome is a ride on a paddle wheel boat in Waupaca (Wisconsin) on October 4th. The \$500 will cover the cost of the boat rental and some snacks on the cruise.

For those who are interested in attending, please come! The paddle wheel boat is called the Chief Waupaca and it is docked at Clearwater Harbor. The regular monthly meeting of the Central Indiana Mensa ExCom was held at Midwest Internet on Tuesday, June 24, 2014.

LocSec Jan Pfeil Doyle called the meeting to order at 6:58 p.m. Members present were: Jan Pfeil Doyle, David Culp, Teresa Gregory, Karen Steilberger, Karen Wilczewski, Bob Zdanky, and Karen Zwick. Absent: Ann Hake. Guest: Jud Horning.

The committee reviewed the minutes of the May ExCom meeting. Karen Zwick moved that the minutes be accepted as presented, Teresa Gregory seconded the motion, and the motion was carried.

Karen Zwick presented the Treasurer's report and made one correction. She also presented the profit and loss statement for the RG and the OG, which showed that CIM nearly broke even on the two events combined. The committee discussed using the information as a basis for budgeting in the future. David Culp made a motion to accept the report as corrected, Karen Wilczewski

Old Business

Member initiatives: Regarding the proposal from George Dunn to hold a formal group activity at the conclusion of the monthly meeting, Jan Pfeil Doyle said that no information was received in time to be included in the next MIND. Flexibility will be built into the meetings to accommodate the activity.

Buzz Fund event: The subcommittee has not met yet. Karen Zwick will get a meeting scheduled.

RG date change: The committee discussed the possibility of moving the RG to the summer from January. The weather would be better, but it would mean we would not have an OG, and at this time there is no guarantee of the availability of the hotel at a different weekend. Jan Pfeil Doyle suggested that the ExCom discuss this more next February or March. There may be other windows of dates available to us at that time.

New Business

RG 2015: Jan Pfeil Doyle said that the Chicago Mensa chapter is moving their AGOG (A Gathering of Gamers) event to February. In the past it has conflicted with our RG.

Teresa Gregory said she would like to offer a free admissions test for each non-member who pays for the full weekend. She would like to get this into the Bulletin, which requires 6 weeks' notice. Karen Zwick moved that we try the idea at the next RG, Bob Zdanky seconded the motion, and the motion was carried. Teresa asked for suggestions for a theme to be sent to her within a week. The committee discussed reusing the WTF (Winter Time Fun) theme.

New member dinner: Bob Zdanky asked the committee members to think about an alternate location for future new member dinners. The next one will be the first Sunday in August.

There being no other business, David Culp made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Karen Wilczewski seconded the motion. The motion was carried, and the meeting was adjourned at 7:38 p.m.

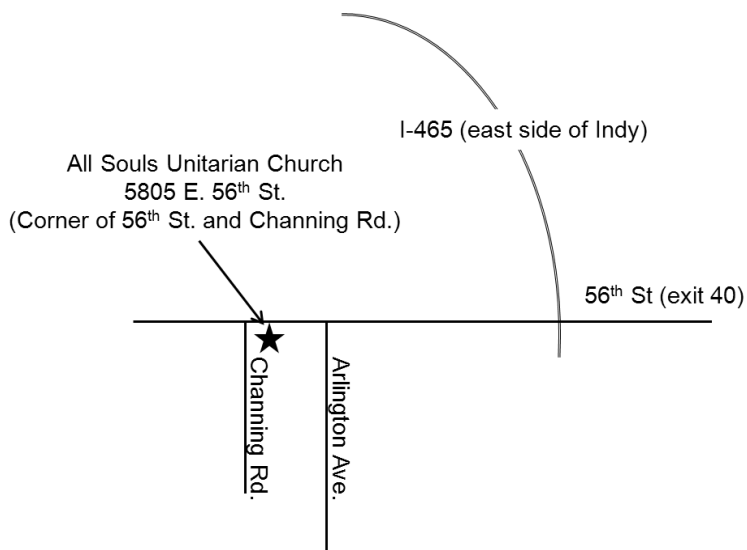
