## Jon's Journal - News for Region 4 Board of Directors (AMC) Update Jon Gruebele, RVC4

In perhaps the most controversial decision made this term, a motion was passed at July's AMC meeting to remove "American Mensa Firehouse" and "American Mensa Hospitality" as official Facebook Groups. "American Mensa" will also be removed from their names. A Task Force will be recommending next steps for consideration at the September 12th AMC meeting. The team should include one active member from each of those Facebook groups. There were strong opinions on both sides of this issue. Some members treasure Firehouse for its unfettered conversation, fun, and caring. Others find many posts there
 flatly unacceptable and a threat to Mensa's reputation. Part of the disconnect may come from how members experience the group. Members can block those who consistently post objectionable content, thus improving their experience.
Unfortunately, new members see it all and are therefore more likely to find issues. It will be interesting to see what the Task Force will recommend. The motion requires the recommendation to be posted to both Facebook groups and e-mailed to members. This will allow for a period of member comment before the AMC votes to accept, amend, or reject the proposal.
The AMC approved the audited financial report for fiscal 2019-2020. The results were dismal. On the plus side, we managed a modest $\$ 70 \mathrm{k}$ operational surplus. On the negative side, we record the value of our investments at the end of March. At that point, the stock market had dropped significantly, and we posted an unrealized $\$ 534 \mathrm{k}$ investment loss. With that more than offsetting the surplus, our net assets dropped $\$ 464 \mathrm{k}$. We therefore ended the year with a total net asset deficit of $\$ 2.2 \mathrm{~m}$. Fortunately, the market has since recovered, but our financial situation remains concerning. Membership renewals have been down this year, possibly due to COVID-related financial concerns. We will need to make very tough choices to reduce expenses moving forward.
The Mensa Foundation announced it had completed the purchase of a new building. As was the case with our old building, American Mensa plans to rent the space from the Foundation. We expect to move into the new offices by the end of 2020.
In other Region 4 news, the AMC voted to approve Chicago's Beth Weiss as the Chair of the 2022 Annual Gathering in Reno, NV. Sangamon Valley Mensa's Laura and Timmy King helped raise $\$ 42,731$ for the Mensa Foundation by competing in the Mr./Ms. Mensa pageant. Normally held at the Annual Gathering (AG), the event moved on-line and raised more than double the amount from any previous year. Our heartfelt thanks go to everyone who competed and donated.

# Books On The Runway

Title: The Preacher and the Constable

Readers who fancy a stimulating stroll down Memory Lane should not miss this newly published gem from the Carmel Clay Historical Society. According to this informative and diverting narrative, long before Carmel, Indiana, evolved into an Arts and Design metropolis housing over 100,000 citizens, it was a modest-sized rural outpost that contained expansive farms, mills, livery stables, and an orphanage. At the cusp of the twentieth century, the town's placid, communal, devoutly Christian environment was briefly shattered by a fatal clash between two of its residents in a Main Street livery stable - a gunfight reminiscent of the fabled OK Corral showdown.

The Preacher and the Constable is a literal "blast from the past" - in essence, a combination murder mystery and study in contrasts, drawing comparisons between the horse-drawn, sparsely-populated, somewhat primitive Carmel of 120 years ago and today's busy, ultra-modern, commerce-driven urban center; as well as the diametrically opposite personalities of the two major characters: a steadfast, devoted public servant and family man versus an erratic, volatile street preacher. As the two protagonists and the various supporting players are intimately fleshed out and the plot unfolds, the suspense builds to a climactic resolution of the underlying mystery: precisely who shot whom, and what were the domestic repercussions? This brief (35-page) Midwest misadventure truly packs a wallop - a welcome temporary escape from our current pandemic purgatory.

## Central Indiana Mensa ExCom 7/21/2020 <br> Ann Hake, CIM Secretary

The regular monthly meeting of the Central Indiana Mensa ExCom was held virtually via Zoom on Tuesday, July 21, 2020.
LocSec Teresa Gregory called the meeting to order at 7:15 pm.
Members present: Vicki Adang, Jan Pfeil Doyle, Teresa Gregory, Ann Hake, Pat Milligan, Kurt Williams, and Bob Zdanky.
Guest: Jon Applegate (Regional Ombudsman).
The committee reviewed the minutes of the June 2020 ExCom meeting. Kurt Williams moved that the minutes be accepted as amended. Jan Pfeil Doyle seconded the motion, and the motion was carried.

The committee reviewed the Treasurer's report for June 2020. Ann Hake moved that the report be accepted. Vicki Adang seconded the motion, and the motion was carried.

A membership report was compiled by Teresa Gregory based upon the information available as of $6 / 30 / 2020$ from American Mensa: 458 members, 0 new, 0 movein, 4 rejoins, and 9 prospects. No candidates were tested due to the COVID-19 restrictions.

## Old Business

Regional Gathering (RG) - tentative planning is still in progress for the 2021 RG, with the recognition that this may not be able to take place due to the pandemic.

Outdoor Gathering (OG) - is still planned for the weekend of May 14-16, 2021. Reservations have been secured at Versailles State Park and a deposit has been made. This deposit is $50 \%$ refundable if we cancel more than 90 days before the event, and $25 \%$ refundable if we cancel 90 days or fewer before the event.

Nominating Committee - comprises Karen Guse (chair) and committee members John Blankenship and Jon Applegate. Jan Pfeil Doyle moved to approve the composition of this committee. Pat Milligan seconded the motion, and the motion was carried.

Election Committee - comprises Diane O'Brien (chair) and committee members Karen Steilberger and Karen Guse. Pat Milligan moved to approve the composition of this committee. Ann Hake seconded the motion, and the motion was carried.

The issue of the MIND containing the ballot for the upcoming election will be sent in paper form to all CIM members to facilitate voting in the upcoming
election, since we will not be holding our September Monthly Gathering in person.

## New Business

Discussion was held regarding Mensa admissions testing. The National office noted that they would not be able to indemnify proctors who chose to test during this outbreak and stressed the risk to proctors, local groups, and American Mensa were a candidate to contract COVID during a testing session. Because of this, along with other factors, the ExCom agreed that it would be best to suspend admissions testing locally until National can indemnify proctors who test, and until it is felt to be safe for all participants. A motion was made by Kurt Williams and seconded by Jan Pfeil Doyle, and the motion was carried.

Discussion was also held regarding in-person vs. virtual meetings. Kurt Williams moved that the ExCom review all potential upcoming in-person gatherings on a monthly basis. Ann Hake seconded the motion, and the motion was carried.

There being no other business, Ann Hake moved that the meeting be adjourned. Kurt Williams seconded the motion. The motion was carried, and the meeting was adjourned at 8:27 pm.
